Bernie lives in Arizona but graciously consented to tell you of his memories of the Knights during our 2nd year as a Council. Bernie writes:

Hi Joe... It was certainly nice to hear from you and fill me in on the activities of the Council. It hardly seems possible that over 20 years have passed since we began Council #7528. I have many fond memories of all our activities since our Council was formed. I am sorry to say that I will not be able to make your meeting on December 3rd but you may use any part of this letter as you see fit.

By the way, I have become active in the Council and Assembly here. This past year, our Holy Family Council #11675 was voted the outstanding Council in the State of Arizona We have a great bunch of Knights here that are willing to work to make it a success. I am Captain of the First Degree team and still do the Grand Knights part.

As for my memories of Council 7528, there many but I am sure you have covered some already... The main ingredient in all our projects was the Knights themselves. Without their dedication to the principle of our Order, most of these projects would not have been as successful...You mentioned that Wayne Moritz spoke about our First Degree Team and our success. That was really fun and I think of the late Ray Brown as Inside Guard, Jim Miles as the music man, the late Frank Hogan as Financial Secretary, the late Bob Fisher as Guide, Bob Hitchcock as Warden, Horace Suinn as Chancelor, and Wayne Moritz as Deputy Grand Knight... They are the ones that made this a huge success.

We had other projects such as the Flowers to the Convalescent Homes for about 20 years on Mothers Day.. We started out giving out a long stem rose to each lady in the home but, the last few years, we gave them Carnations so the stickers would not hurt their hands.. Some of the women there never receive a visit, a card, or phone call on that day and our flowers really made them feel good. I saw many of them with tears in their eyes; they were so appreciative. One time, one lady said she didn't want a rose but would rather have a kiss so Roy Nelson planted one on her which really made her day. There was so much joy for

those of us who passed them out as well as the Ladies.

I remember other projects that helped so many people, like the paving project on 308th. It was called to our attention that the students of FW High School had to walk in the street to keep from getting hit by cars. Our council petitioned the County to lay an asphalt walk on the south side of 308th for safety sake and they responded by doing this. Now, they can walk freely along that street as well as other people in that area

The Christmas project back in the beginning had the total support of our Council.. Wayne Moritz and I chaired this for many years and we worked through the Catholic Community Services as "Adopt a Family Program". They would assign us a family and then we would purchase gifts for each member of that family. Then, we would deliver them just before Christmas. I can remember one family in particular that had a tree up when we got there but there were no presents under the tree so our donation was very special. Many Knights from our council donated money for this very worthy cause.. As a sidelight, we received a National Award from Supreme for this project.

There were so many other projects such as moving Father Vannesse's Church in Buckley and painting it under Bob Hitchcock's direction.

As you know, our main goal has always been to support our Priests and there is no more crucial time than now to do just that. They, in turn, support all of our projects.

The fish-fries, potlucks, etc. were a main source of our enjoyment over the years.

The most gratifying reward from being an active member of the Knights is how you learn to work with all members and appreciate them individually.. I remember when we were having our 25th anniversary of the Parish and Father had one Mass for the entire parish in the gymnasium at FW High and the Knights were asked to move some chairs tables to the gym, put up banners, etc.. I borrowed a truck from work and we made several trips but that is when I met Arnie

Luvtosky as he rode shotgun with me in the truck. He really helped and I am sure he's a still a good member of Council 7528!

I have rambled on but, when I think of all the benefits I have received from the Knights, I can't understand why all Catholic gentlemen wouldn't want to join. I was looking through some of my old memories of the Knights and ran across the program for the State Convention in 1983 and saw your picture as District Deputy and also mine was in there as State Family-Life Director. That brought back some great memories. Say hello to all my friends and Brother Knights. Hope to see you on our next trip up North.

My brothers, our Council has chosen to sponsor five seminarians this fraternal year. They are Vu Tran, Thomas Nathe, Peter Mactutis, James Thurman and Anthony Lezcano. Throughout the coming year, we will feature an article on each of these seminarians. This month we start with Thomas Nathe at Mount Angels Seminary in Oregon. Thomas writes:

I would say that I have sensed a call to the priesthood since my first memory of seeing a priest. Perhaps I was about six or so, and from that time until I was 27, I fought against the idea. Being a spiritual and moral guide meant that I would have to be different than everyone else and that was a way of being different that I was just not interested in being. Of course, from the adolescent years on, celibacy seemed to be an insurmountable obstacle as well. When I was 26 going on 27, I had a supernatural conversion experience. Of course all conversions are supernatural by their nature; ultimately, mine would lead me to say, "yes" to the Lord's desire for me to be one of His priest's. At the core of it all, I came to know the Lord Jesus Christ personally. And what of the Lord specifically did I come to know? I came to know, with the conviction of my life, that Jesus existed, was God, was infinitely powerful, and was infinitely good, loving and merciful. Having been in love at one time in college, I certainly understood how powerful love could be. The Lord blessed me with His grace of love. An infinite and perfect love was simply more than I could say "no" too. I could finally give the Lord what He had wished for me from the start. Within a year and a half of the start of my conversion, I was accepted as a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Seattle and sent to Mt. Angel.

Four and a half years have passed since first coming to Mt. Angel. They have been the most spiritual & matriculating years of my life. I am now in my third year of Theology (second to the last). By the grace of God, I will be ordained to the transitional diaconate sometime next summer and to the priesthood in the summer of 2004.

I want to thank the Knights of Columbus for the incredible support that you give to the seminarians. Your support through prayer and almsgiving truly does make a difference. May the Lord continue to bless all of you and your families. May the Lord be with you.

#### MEMORIAL TO UNBORN CHILDREN

Launched in 1992, at the suggestion of Cardinal John O'Conner of New York, this program has rapidly resulted in more than 2,000 memorials to unborn children being erected in the United States and around the world.

Our own St. Joseph Council #7528 has long desired to place a Memorial to Unborn Children someplace on the St. Vincent de Paul parish campus. After consulting with Fr. Tom, a committee was formed and locations are now under consideration.

One such location would be the plaza area adjacent to the South Narthex. The actual design of the Memorial is still being developed, however, a bronze statue of some type and the original baptismal font from the old church will be components of the design. An example is on display tonight in the hall.

The Knights wish to thank the St. Vincent de Paul parish for their support of this Memorial. It is our hope that it will be a visual reminder in a public way of the sanctity and dignity of all human life from its earliest moments.
