He was walking out of the PX(store) when our base came under a rocket attack. He was approximately 25 feet from where the rocket exploded. He was blown to the ground like all the others nearby. He then ran back into the PX when he noticed 9-10 people lying on the ground injured and bleeding. He then ran out from building and began dragging the injured back into the building. While he was doing that he heard the "whhzz" of another incoming rocket and jumped to the ground. Luckily that rocket did not explode and the attack ended after that. He then assisted ambulance crews in loading the injured. He came back covered in blood and shaken but what he did was heroic and worthy of note by others. That is why I share this with you. He suffered a perforated eardrum and remained shaken for a few days after but otherwise unscathed. As for me, I was at a dining facility eating chow the whole time. 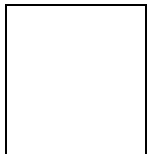
