# A Message from the Grand Knight

those Catholic gentlemen that you know who would make a positive contribution to our membership. When you have a form 100 filled in, give it to our Membership Director, David Myers. Also, if you feel that you need a little assistance talking to a candidate, ask David. He and the Recruiting Committee will see what they can do.

Speaking of the First Degree Exemplification, this one was held in honor of Tony Robinson. Tony is a long time member and a Past Grand Knight of this council as well as the current ceremonial Grand Knight of our First Degree Team. He has a "can-do" attitude and when something needs doing, he is the guy to see. He has been coordinating our annual Lenten Fish Fry's since before I became a Knight. It was my pleasure to select Tony to be the Honoree for this Exemplification.

While I am talking about our First Degree Team, let me just say that these guys are amazing! With Al Larpenteur moving to Woodinville last year, it left us with a vacancy on the team. Ken Baune stepped up, volunteered to learn the part of Chancellor, and did a superb job for his first time in the role. The whole team is excellent... And you should come hear them perform! As a member of the council witnessing an Exemplification, you can actually listen to the words and let their meaning soak in. This is something I like to do. It reminds me and renews my perspective of these basic principles. Also,

there is always room on the team for alternates.

On September 10<sup>th</sup>, the parish held it's annual Fall Festival. Even though the day started out with some heavy rain, I believe that it was a resounding success. The Festival kicked off with the Parade of Flags and the Knights of Columbus leading the Pledge of Allegiance. Knights helped with the setting up as well as the taking down and clean up of the festival. Our brothers prepared the coleslaw, beans, hot dogs, and our world famous (at least the world of St. Vincent's parish) brats and chicken. That new secret recipe for the chicken was delicious and had just the right amount of kick. Of course, the beer garden is always a favorite. Many of our brother Knights and their families were involved in other aspects of the festival, such as entertainment or international food booths. I hope that if you weren't able to participate in the activities that the council organized, you and your family at least were able to share in the fun and socializing of the parish.

At our recent planning meeting, a question was brought up about what instruction in our Faith is available to us as Knights. There are a number of resources available to us and what I am going to mention here only scratches the surface. Our parish offers guite a range of adult education courses and seminars. If you are interested in these, contact the parish office and/or watch for notices in the bulletin. RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is an option, and a good one. This course is designed for those who are studying to become Catholic. However, it does not preclude you from signing up and attending, to refresh your knowledge as an existing Catholic, or if you wish to further your understanding of the Faith.

If you have access to the Internet, you can go to the Supreme Web Site at: <a href="http://www.kofc.org/un/index.cfm">http://www.kofc.org/un/index.cfm</a> and there is a link on the left that is labeled: Catholic Information Service (CIS). Click on this link and you can explore what is available. They have several courses, which you can sign

up and take on-line or you can have them send you a printed copy for free. If you do not have access to the internet, but are interested in one or more of these courses, contact Tim Philomeno or myself and we will see to it that they are ordered for you. If anyone is interested in setting up a course or discussion group, bring your ideas to the next planning meeting.

Along the same lines, I would like to encourage all Knights of Columbus to join the Father Michael J. McGivney Guild. The Guild serves as a source for information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney. The Guild distributes informational materials about him, receives reports of favors granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. Guild members receive regular updates on the progress of Father McGivney's cause for canonization and are invited to participate in promoting devotion to this Servant of God. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. It is free. You can join on-line at: http://www.fathermcgivney.org or there is an ad printed each month in the Columbia magazine which you can send in, or contact me for an application.

Those of you that have sponsored a new Knight have received a certificate from Supreme for points that can be used to "purchase" items from a catalog that is provided. At the last planning meeting, I proposed that anyone having any of these certificates that they don't plan to use for themselves, could donate the certificates to be used to acquire items for the council. I also suggested that the first item that we ought to acquire is a K of C flag. This "costs" 20,000 points and the certificates are worth 500 points each. Ken Baune volunteered to oversee this project, so if you would like to donate any certificates, give them to Ken.

As you know, Joe Penwell is the chairman of our "Good of the Order" committee. He is the point of contact when you want to report someone who is sick or distressed and in need of our prayers. Joe will add these names to the list and see to it that the appropriate action is taken. Horace Suinn made a suggestion after a recent visit to Alex Plys. My immediate reaction to the suggestion was "why haven't we been doing this all along?" In any case, he suggested that we have a procedure in place to ensure that our brothers and widows that are not able to come to Mass are provided Communion. The parish does have a ministry that provides this service and Ralph Horner has volunteered to coordinate our end by ensuring that the names are on the list. So, continue to contact Joe

Penwell with requests for prayers and information about our "sick or distressed", and he will pass the appropriate information on to Ralph. If you are a Eucharistic Minister, you may already participate in this Ministry, or maybe you would like to become involved.
