There are several pages available to you or anyone without the need to log in. One of these is the Email Aliases Page. On this page you can find an email alias (an address that will forward your email to the person you are trying to contact) for each of the officers and chairmen of the council. Even when the person changes to a new office, the email is forwarded to the person currently in that office.

Another page that anyone can visit is the "News from our local Fourth Degree Assembly" page. The link is under the Council Programs menu. On that page.

Over the past four years......the seating capacity for the Crab Feed grew to 408 seats. That's seventeen tables with twenty four chairs. Four hundred and eight people in one room, so tight you couldn't slip a greased BB in there. Now that's a lot of folks rolling up their sleeves and enjoying the fresh Dungeness crab, Italian salad, chowder and deserts, let alone the beers and wine. That's right, we grew up and used the "old vestibule" with the addition of fifty....that's right 50 more folks able to take us to the new record of 458 contented and highly spirited diners. Regardless of what they said, it was a great experience with the new addition.

From my standpoint, the best part of heading up this event is the opportunity to work with such an amazing group of men and woman.....yes we have the 5 ladies who yearly volunteer and serve the beer and wine. As well as the Mission Trekkers....the young women and men (with some of their parents) who provide the outstanding service we've come to enjoy. In order for an event this size to be so successful, it takes a well orchestrated group under the direction of strong team leaders who know what needs to be done and marshals their efforts in a timely fashion. Bill Martin and his hard working crew transformed an empty hall into a precisely measured grouping of tables set and ready for business. The Kitchen leader and go to guy Tony Robinson and the chowder stirrers and salad makers and garlic bread slicers and cheesecake swizellers. Then there's the one-man team of Dan Reeb who can't say no to anything. Raffle tickets and clean up headed by my trusted and loyal partner in crab crime......Ken Baune a terrific co-chair. And finally all you Knights who helped in so many ways and made the evening go so smoothly.

So how well did we do? Very well thank you. With combined ticket sales and beer and wine sales.... after expenses, we collected \$8,012.71. We again exceeded

previous years raffle sales expectations after paying \$500.00, \$300.00 and \$200.00 in prize awards we brought in \$2,003.00. So you can see it was a very good night.....the total was \$10,015.71.

Lastly, I'm blessed to spearhead this yearly occasion and grateful for all of your support and effort. It's no wonder this Council continues to grow and make a name for itself.
