I am excited to be your Chancellor this year. One of the most pressing issues this year for The Knights of Columbus as well as the Church in Washington State, is I- 1000. The so called "Death

with Dignity" initiative. In reality it is a dangerous, poorly written law that puts the most vulnerable at risk. I came across and article about an Oregon women who is terminally ill with Lung Cancer. She was denied life extending medication from the State run insurance, however, they approved the medicine to euthanize her. The drugs to extend her life cost \$4,000 a month. However, the drugs to end her life only cost \$50.00.

This is under the more restrictive Oregon law. Even supporters of the Physicians assisted suicide law in Oregon admit this was never the intent. Life is too precious to be summed up on a spreadsheet. Hi Brother Knights - my name is David Caton, and I'm honored to be your Health Minister for the Knights of Columbus for another year.

I've been in this role for about 10 years here (and 4 years in Bellevue) and I help coordinate our parish blood drives as well as work with my wife, Mary, as a co-coordinator for our parish monthly blood pressure checks and yearly Parish Flu clinics. Mary and I are also representatives to the Family Ministry Board of your parish.

I've been fortunate enough to have had a wonderful Optometric practice at Group Health Cooperative for the past 30 years, with my last 10 years here in Federal Way (and 5 years in the Medical Dental Building as well as 13 years in Burien.)
