It has come to my attention that there are some bits of information about the Knights of Columbus that are either not disseminated or are sometimes misunderstood. One of those is when a brother Knight moves out of reasonable commute distance to our council. Quite often there are questions about transferring to another council. This is often confusing, but a transfer (whether in or out of the council) does not affect our Membership Recruitment Goal and therefore is not a bad thing.

When you move away from our community, you decide whether you remain a member of our council or transfer to one near you... You will remain in our council until you do transfer, which is accomplished by contacting the local council and filling out a form 100. This is always a tough thing to explain and guite often misunderstood But, as long as you would like to remain in our council, you are welcome here. My personal feeling has long been that if a member would be more likely to be an active member, then he should transfer to the council that works best for him. So, it is totally up to you. Find the local council and check them out - see if it would be a good fit. Another point you might not be aware of, you can attend their meetings as a member at large (without transferring into their council) as long as you have your current membership card (which Tim will continue to mail to you as long as you continue to pay your dues). You would be a guest, not a voting member, but it would give you an opportunity to check them out. This could be especially good if you have more than one council to choose from."

I hope that this has cleared up any misconceptions about transfers. If you have other questions about the Knights of Columbus or our council, send them to me at webmaster@kofc7528.org and I will try to answer them in a future edition of the Cross and Compass. If I don't know the answer, I will try my best to find out.
