



RETENTION

Have you ever thought to your self, "I cannot affect Retention, because this is an individual choice to be active, pay membership dues and to volunteer. Or, "our council is strong and active and if someone is not involved then that is their choice." You are 100% correct, that it is a personal choice, but do we have excellent fraternity, listen to all brothers, ask questions, help them feel welcome and teach/train all of our new brother knights? I recently visited the Kellogg, Idaho council and they really struggle with retention. Year after year our council is alive and active in recruiting, but what happens after we have a brother knight complete their first degree?

Retention has many pieces to the puzzle and to name a few in order of importance involves;

- 1. **Active** Sponsorship, 2nd & 3rd degrees and fraternal brotherly love. I want to challenge everyone in our council who knows a brother who has not gone through the 2nd & 3rd degree or attended a meeting or event in the last year to call and invite them back. Maybe you find out they are going through a physical ailment or some hard times. The fact that you called, invited them, and let them know you care about them is the important part. Next, all of our new brother knights who have joined our council in the last 1, 2, 3 years or further back and have not been seen must be contacted by their **sponsor** to invite them back. Let them know about our upcoming events and council meetings. It is imperative that every brother who join (s) our St. Joseph council knows they are a valued member and they can volunteer to give back in numerous ways.
- 2. Next, the most crucial piece to Retention is when we see a new brother knight attend their first Spaghetti Feed, Christmas Potluck, Crab Feed, Pro-Life dinner, or Lenten Fish Fry, this is when we really reach out and include them. Help find a job that that allows them to work and be involved in the event and take the time to get to know this new brother knight. Let them know we appreciate their time and membership in our council.
- 3. Last but not least, all sponsors must insure they make it to a council meeting and attend it with them. If a sponsor cannot attend that first meeting than he must assign someone else to attend the meeting and fill in for them as a sponsor at that first council meeting. We must be active in Retention and it requires all of us working the Retention piece to make it happen. Remember "Sponsoring a brother knight is a life long commitment". Let's help keep our council number one, by helping to work Retention.


