We've all been waiting and it's finally here! This year marks the first year that the Washington State Council is doing the Tootsie Roll Program to help people with intellectual disabilities. Our council has already started planning for this very worthwhile cause which will take place over the weekend of Friday October 7<sup>th</sup> through Sunday October 9<sup>th</sup>.

Here's how it works. Volunteers wearing attractive bright yellow aprons will be stationed outside of local stores and other high-



traffic areas handing out large, specially packaged tootsie rolls while accepting voluntary donations. The tootsie rolls are highly subsidized by the Tootsie Roll Company and include special markings on the outside of the wrapper as well as specific information inside of the wrapper about the program.

Volunteers will be organized to stores generally North of S. 320<sup>th</sup> Street, including the 320<sup>th</sup> Safeway and the Target at the Commons. St. Theresa's council will be fundraising at stores South of S 320<sup>th</sup> Street .
