### From Your Lecturer

# Mere Christianity by C. S. Lewis

This article continues my summary of the compilation titled Mere Christianity by C. S. Lewis in which he offers his views

on then basic tenets of Christianity that led to his own conversion from atheism to belief in Christ. As has been noted, these beliefs were delivered as radio speeches delivered to the people of Britain during the Second World War.

lieve. He states that as a Christian you do not have to believe that all other religions are simply wrong all through. As a Christian you are free to believe that all other religions have some hint of the truth. But being a Christian does mean that where Christianity differs from other religions, Christianity is right and they are wrong. Christianity lines up with the majority who believe in some kind of God or gods vice the minority who foster Western materialism.

Those who believe in God also can be divided into those who think that God is beyond good and evil, so-called Pantheism; and Christians who believe in "a God who takes sides, who loves love and hates hatred, who wants us to behave in one way and not another".

Pantheists also believe that the universe is almost a God. That anything one finds in the universe is a part of God. Christians believe that God formed the universe, but He is separate from the universe and some of the things we see in it are contrary to His will, and God insists that we put them right again.

But why has this world without question gone so wrong? How would we know that something is wrong unless we have an idea of right and wrong, of just and unjust. There are absolutes which we can agree on are not simply the fanciful notions of individuals but a sensible belief in true justice. Consequently, atheism turns out to be too simplistic. If the whole universe has no meaning, then we should never have found out that it has no meaning.

The Invasion. Lewis goes on to explain that Christianity is not a simple religion. It is complicated by doctrines concerning sin, hell, the devil and redemption. Those wanting a simple religion where there is a good God in Heaven and all is well consciously or unconsciously want to destroy Christianity. He states that "... their idea of God 'making religion simple'; as if religion were something God invented, and not His statement to us of certain unalterable facts about His own nature". Reality also is usually something you could not have guessed. Christianity offers us a universe that we would not have guessed, and not the sort of thing that someone would make up. Christianity's view is that this is a good world that has gone bad, but knows what it should have been.

Another view at odds with Christianity is called Dualism. This notion is that there are two independent powers i.e. gods, one good, one bad which battle in the universe in an endless war. But this means that we follow whatever we prefer at any given moment. We would be picking a side. But this means that there is a higher standard by which we measure good or bad. We call the author of this standard the real God. Moreover, if Dualism is true, then there is a being who likes badness for its own sake. But this means that such a being is getting its existence, will and intelligence, which are good from the good power. Isn't this what Christianity calls the devil, a fallen angel. "It is a real recognition that evil is a parasite, not an original thing. The powers which enable evil are powers given to it by goodness". However, Christianity does admit that there is a dark power in the universe at battle with good. But it was created by God, and was good when created.

The Shocking Alternative. But is the existence of an evil power in accordance with God's will or not? If it is, then He is a strange God; not how can anything happen contrary to the will of Him who has absolute power? But that is the consequence of free will. What God may will to be His creatures can choose right or wrong. But why did God make creatures with free will? Because free will is "also the only thing makes possible any love or goodness or joy worth having. A world of creatures that worked like machines would hardly be worth creating". The sin of Satan was that given free will, he wanted to be God. And that was what he offers to the human race, to create their own happiness outside of God. Out of this has come all that is wrong with human history: selfishness, poverty, ambition, war, slavery and class struggle. But this cannot succeed because "God designed the human machine to run on Himself". As a result, God gave us a conscience, the sense of right and wrong. He also sent us stories of god's who die, come to life again and give men new life. And finally, He selected one particular people who received knowledge about who He was, that there was only one of Him, and that He cared about right conduct. Then from the Jewish people there arose a man who said what was the most shocking thing ever uttered by human lips. Jesus claimed that he could forgive sins. He forgave those offenses that others committed against their fellow man. "This makes sense only is this man was really God whose law is broken and whose loved is wounded in every sin", writes Lewis.

The Perfect Penitent. With such a claim Jesus is who he says he is or is a lunatic. But does one really believe that Jesus was a lunatic? Then he must be God. God has come to this world in human form. But for what purpose? The central Christian belief is that Christ's death has somehow put us right with God and given us a fresh start. But how is the matter of conjecture. Lewis' view is that the fact that it is not understandable, shows us that it beyond our nature. Christ died for us, it cleansed our sins, and destroyed the power of death. That is Christianity. If God merely wanted to let us off, He could have without punishing an innocent person. But like a debt that must be repaid, so too our sins have a cost that sometimes falls on others to fulfill. But our part is to admit our faults, saying we are sorry and promising to change our behavior. This is what Christians call repentance. The catch is only a bad person needs to repent; but only a good person can repent perfectly. The only person that can repent perfectly is a perfect person. Jesus was that perfect person because he could suffer and die as a human, but do it perfectly because he was God.

The Practical Conclusion. If we share in the suffering and humility of Christ we also share in his conquest of death. In the Christian view a new kind of man appeared. A new kind of life appeared which began in Him is to be put in us. There are three things that spread the Christ-life to us: baptism, belief and Holy Communion. For we Catholics, Holy Communion is the focus of Mass. When Christians say the Christ-life is in them, they mean that Christ is actually operating through them. We are his hands and feet. It explains why this new life is spread not just through mental acts, but by bodily acts like baptism and Holy Communion. God never meant man to be a spiritual creature, but uses material things like bread and wine

to put new life in us. Someday (we don't know when) God will come and bring a reconning to all. For now God is giving us the chance to choose which side we fall on. Now today, God is giving us a chance to choose the right side.
