



Volunteer Emergency Workers Are Needed For Key Roles During Emergencies!

During a disaster such as a major earthquake or sever storm, community response and recovery would be greatly enhanced by the services and skills provided by volunteer emergency workers. The key is to have established teams of trained volunteers in place prior to the disaster.

Recognizing this fact, the Greater Federal Way Emergency Management Program is currently seeking volunteers interested in becoming a volunteer emergency worker. Please consider helping your community by becoming a volunteer emergency worker in the Greater Federal Way Emergency Management Program.

Training will be provided on a continuing basis. Areas that volunteer emergency workers could serve in:

Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Support – trained volunteers would serve in the EOC serving as liaisons, situation unit, plotters, runners and other areas as needed.

EOC Radio Operations – trained volunteers would operate the EOC radio systems relaying communications to and from the EOC.

Damage Assessment Team – This team would be dispatched by the EOC to collect and provide city damage assessment information to EOC staff.

Wellness and Information Team – This team would be dispatched to pre-identified areas to conduct wellness checks and provide information concerning the emergency at information points through out the city.

Shelter Operations Team – This team would be called upon to staff and manage emergency shelters established within the city.

Community Points of Distribution Team (CPOD) – This team would be called upon to staff and manage a CPOD site. At this site, essential supplies such as food, water, tarps and ice will be given out to disaster victims.

Volunteer and Donation Management Team – This team would assist in managing volunteers and staffing the volunteer and donation reception center.
